The Carolyn Cox Scholarship Fund

Every long-lived organization has its quiet heroes; people who provide the on-going effort and support that ensures the long-term survival of the entity. For The University of Akron Women's Club (UAWC), one of these people is Carolyn Cox. Over the years, Carolyn has supported the UAWC through participation in our programs and by hosting events in her home.

Here are two things you may not know about Carolyn. One fascinating detail is that Carolyn has been instrumental in saving and propagating a magnificent tree; a tree thought to be extinct for over 5 million years...the Dawn Redwood (pictured far right). The Dawn Redwood can now be found in several locations in Summit County including the homes of our members who have planted the seeds that Carolyn gave us.

The second thing you may not know is that Carolyn Cox led the effort to create our scholarship fund. Beginning almost 30 years ago in 1992, Carolyn envisioned the creation of a \$10,000 scholarship fund for UA's women students. She has consistently supported that fund with her donations, and with additional donations in the memory of others.

That original \$10,000 has grown through donations and fund-raisers until, for the past three years, we have been able to fund three \$8,000 scholarships each year (a total of \$24,000) to three groups of remarkable UA women.

It is with these memories and our fond affection for Carolyn that the Board of the UAWC has voted unanimously to rename our annual scholarship the Carolyn Cox Scholarship Fund.



In my personal thoughts as President of the UAWC, Carolyn Cox has planted many seeds in her life, not just trees. I personally remember the first time I met Carolyn Cox at my first UAWC meeting. She was so vibrant and peppy, inspiring me to join the UAWC that night! And, I have remained with the club for 14 years, now serving in my second term as President. For me, proposing this idea to the UAWC Board was simply the BEST award to recognize this dedicated lady that has inspired and continues to inspire so many people!

Public Tour at NASA Glenn Research Center

Interested in a stimulating tour? Here's one for you.

To celebrate the 20th anniversary of a continuous human presence on the International Space Station this year, **NASA's Glenn Research Center** is offering 45-minute guided tours once a month from April through October on a Saturday. The tours will provide an inspiring, behind-the-scenes look at America's world-class research facilities.

Glenn tours will take place at Glenn's Lewis Field. Tours are free, but reservations are required. On each tour, visitors will explore a laboratory and see where scientists and engineers conduct research to develop propulsion, power and communications technologies for NASA's aeronautics and space missions. At the end of each tour, guests will visit Glenn's Gift Shop.

Leslie and I have chosen the tour mentioned below because it features laboratories necessary to the success of the International Space Station, and the July date seems preferable to the other offerings.

Tour: Graphics & Visualization (GVIS) Laboratory and the Reconfigurable User-

interface and Virtual Reality Exploration (GRUVE) Laboratory. "Come see things in

a different light!" so the news release says.

When: Saturday, July 11, at either 10 or 11 a.m. (11 is our first choice)

Where: Glenn Lewis Field, 21000 Brookpark Road, Cleveland

(just west of the Cleveland Hopkins Airport)

Restrictions/requirements:

The program is limited to U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents. A tour bus departs from Glenn's main gate, where attendees must present a government-issued identification (driver's license, state ID, green card) for admission. Spouses are invited to join the group.

Because advance registration is required one month prior to the tour, we will request the tour on June 11.
