In the Spotlight featuring Susan Colville-Hall

Susan has been a UAWC member since she retired from UA in 2014. Her former student, Diana Kunze, became a professional friend, then just a good friend and convinced Susan that it was a great organization.

In 1989 Susan joined the College of Education. She later earned the title Emeritus of Teacher Education in Foreign Languages, after her 25 years with UA. Prior to that, she taught French (and/or Spanish) in Connecticut and Colorado in secondary schools (18 years) and 3 years as a GA at OSU.

Susan is pleased to have held offices with the UAWC including Scholarship Chair and Book Review Co-chair. Some of her favorite special activities include Hiking, Book Review, and Discussion.

Talk about travel, Susan has been to all but five of the U. S. states, France (multiple times including visiting professor), Mexico, Canada, Costa Rica, Spain, Italy, Morocco, Kenya, Greece, former Yugoslavia, Austria, Hungary, Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Netherlands, Belgium, England, Switzerland, Brazil, China (visiting professor). She has secondary, university and professional groups to France, Costa Rica, Mexico, and China, sometimes as part of the Fulbright Hayes or another type of grant. Susan's first time as group leader was to France with the Experiment in International Living in 1971. She never stopped seeing the beauty in new cultures, new languages, new foods and customs. Unfortunately, Susan is in withdrawal this year due to COVID guidelines and restrictions for travel.

Susan listens to most kinds of music (classical, Jon Batiste and jazz, folk, rock, Celtic, etc.). She also likes to dance. She was active in starting up a group to go to concerts together, but Covid-19 got in the way!!

The Coville-Hall family includes Susan's husband Steve, her step-daughter of Alaska Jennifer and husband Gordon (graduate from Firestone HS) and their sons Liam (electrical engineer in WA) and Riley (senior at UA in Fairbanks). Other family members include Susan's stepson Dan of Seattle, stepson David of Nantucket and his wife Lizie, and their daughters Linnie (ceramics in CN) and Jule (real estate).

Susan is so active. She enjoys reading new fiction and non-fiction. She also picks up mysteries and cookbooks!!! Her favorite place is Stow Munroe Falls Public Library, but she's not limited to just one library. Susan will frequent Akron (downtown and Highland Square), Hudson, Cuyahoga Falls and Kent to get the best selections.



Since 1970 through 2017 Susan has biked with her husband locally as well as during national and international trips. They have been members of League of American cyclists, International Bike Touring (now Bike Adventure Club), Akron Bike Club, ROMEOs and JULIETs (retired old men eating out / just unique ladies interested in eating too). Some of their trips include Roscoe Ramble from here to Coshocton and back; Lewis & Clark Trail from St. Charles MO to Bismark ND; White Rim Trail in Canyonlands; French Alps Tour; Southern France Tour; Texas Hill Country; New Mexico Tour; DelMarVa Tour (Delaware, Maryland and Virgina); The Danube Bike Trail in Austria & Hungary. According to Susan, "you really get to know the countryside when pedaling through on a bike. I think we may have it in us to do one more international bike trip. Hope so!!!"

Susan has been Dragon boating with the Dragon Dream Team since 2013. It's Ohio's only all breast cancer survivor team. It's an awesome group. Her team placed 3rd in International Competition in Florence, Italy, in 2018. The team practices three times a week at Rex Lake from May through October 10 in a normal year. Last year was NOT normal so Susan picked up kayaking thanks to my teammates.

Susan also enjoys skiing when there's snow at Boston Mills; sometimes she gets to go to Colorado to ski with friends in the winter. She started snowshoeing with Susan B. Women's Stomp for the Cure in Frisco, CO, which she says is really fun. She will try it here if there's ever enough snow.

We are thrilled to have Susan with our club. She says it's been delightful getting to know these fun ladies and she's proud to be associated with the University of Akron Women's Club. She looks forward to the meetings, even on Zoom. Susan encourages more women to join. It's a great outlet for activities and getting to try new things. Susan looks forward to doing the theater trip in Canada soon.

Book review met on Wednesday, January 13, 2021 to review this compelling novel by Aminatta Forna.


Place: Waterloo Bridge, London.




