














Nickel Boys Review

With 14 group members attending*, Denise Beck guided the discussion through the horrors that took place at the Arthur G. Dozier School for Boys as Elwood, the 11-year-old who was wrongfully committed to this reform institution, tells his experiences. Colson Whitehead is a master storyteller who revealed the secrets of this boys' reform institution while exposing the process by which Americans try to hide or erase the uncomfortable stories of slavery, Jim Crow and today's racism. It wasn't until 2012, when University of South Florida anthropologists uncovered graves of the boys who died under the mistreatment they received there that the world began to care. The discussion covered topics of trauma, friendship, racism, the historical influence on society, and hope. It was a lively examination of many issues raised by this talented author. Thank you, Marsha Friedman, for linking us through Zoom.
