Proceeds from the Silent Auction amounted to \$2,490.41. The 50/50 raffle brought in \$77, (\$39) for the cause and Leslie Bain took home the other (\$38). The auction itself amounted to \$1,079 and total donations were \$1,365 (Tudor House donations \$815; checks sent by mail \$550)



## IN THE SPOTLIGHT with Sharon Gandee

Sharon, a UAWC member since the 1980s, resides in the Sand Run area of Akron, Ohio. A native of Akron, she grew up in Hawkins area. Sharon taught high school English in Wadsworth for 28 years, including the inspiration for adoption of AP courses in the school district. She is "passionate about education for all," as she shared her disapproval for inequities in education.

**Connection to The University:** When Sharon's husband Bob became the Department Head for Physical Education, Jean Maluke prompted her initiation to the organization: "You will join the Faculty Women's Club."

Upon joining the book review group, Sharon was absolutely "blown away" by the insight of older members of the group reviewing the book "The Color Purple." Reflecting on this first experience with the ladies reviewing this book, Sharon commented, "I love being in the company of these women. They were free -thinking, aware, intelligent women."

Speaking of her connection to Marie Richardson, Sharon stated that "She was brilliant. I still have flowers from her garden, as do others members."

**Offices held/Participation:** Book Review has been Sharon's major involvement, plus Tour Group and Gourmet Group, with as many as 29 people at her home for a gourmet dinner. But, book review has been her biggest connection.

**Favorite Activity:** "My favorite activity has been the Book Review group, but I have enjoyed the other social gatherings," shared Sharon. "Early on, The Faculty Women's group was really quite a social organization. The music of the band 'E5' (named for the education department band of 5) played at Christmas party and dance events which were university wide with current employees of the university." She added, "Now, most of our members are retired."

**Travel:** Sharon has experienced many traveling opportunities over the years, including Africa, Europe, and Russia. "Italy, I have traveled there several times...always my favorite."

Sharon went on to explain that "when I retired, I had three places that I wanted to go. Now my pin map has 17 pins, often traveling with the Vukovich's "member Diane Vukovich and her husband's tour group."

Sharing another extended travel experience, Sharon explained, "Bob and I spent a semester in Korea in 1992. Bob was an exchange professor. It was a real culture shock. It was very different. But, we learned to adapt to things like the food, and we learned to love it."

**Family:** We have two daughters, Gabrielle and Nicole, but Gabrielle died at the age of 45. When asked about the passing of Gabrielle, Sharon responded, "We do not know what it was, that caused the death,...I know too many people who have lost kids." No grandchildren. Sharon, as many know, has been married twice...both times to Bob. It is a running joke that Bob was interviewed about caring the Olympic torch, and was quoted as saying that this torch-bearing honor was the most nervous he has ever been...besides being married. To which, a friend jokingly asked, "Which time?"

**Other Interesting Notes:** During the time period of 1970-1972, Sharon explained that she and Bob took leaves of absences from their work and pursued graduate degrees at The Ohio State University in Columbus: A Master's degree for Sharon and PhD for Bob. Sharon reflected fondly on this move, sharing the planning and passion behind their educational choice: "We saved up the money, paid for our graduate education and health insurance. We lived on an extremely limited income for two years with two kids, a 5-year-old and a 1-year-old. That was a delightful time."

Other interesting notes from Sharon include that she and Bob have entertained international university students with Global Ties, which is a program that connects foreign students with a host, where "the students live with their host for a week or two, until they find accommodations," explained Sharon.

Also, Sharon and Bob are part of a small private gourmet group with four couples, meeting quarterly for over 30 years.

Favorite quote: "If you disagree, silence is consent."

Coincidentally, as the interviewer of Sharon Gandee for this piece, I, Carrie Tomko, can state that the reason that I chose Sharon for this "spotlight" is due to the fact that I have always admired Sharon's powerful communication attribute, with a willingness to take a solid stance on a subject, yet being open to discussion, but always firm on commitment to her beliefs. She communicates this dance of firmness and fairness with an elegance that I personally admire in Sharon's communication wheel house.

**Concluding Comment:** Stated Sharon, "I have shared a lot with this group of ladies...it allowed us <Bob and Sharon> to meet people like Betty and John Seiberling...Betty was a treasure...so down-to-earth...so many fascinating women...!"

## Hiking the Richfield Heritage Preserve

On August 19, 2021, Susan Colville-Hall, Bev Cinovec, Hillary Sullivan, Leslie Bain, Therese Sheffer, Denise Beck, Patricia Schorr, and Linda Sugarman hiked the Richfield Heritage Preserve. Trails abound in the green space here and remnants of life in the late 1800s and early 1920s pop out of the woods again and again. We hiked almost 3 miles by the time the morning was over.

Dave Green, Preserve Director, presented a history of the Richfield Heritage Preserve and answered questions about this awesome green space at the end of our trek on this historic site. The park housed the Girl Scout Camp from all of greater Cleveland for 70 years up to 2000. Photos from camp days of Bev Cinovec demonstrate one historic element of these lands. Inventor James Kirby lived here for a good portion of his productive life and created a variety of inventions inspired by the surrounding environment and used the environment to tryout his new fangled ideas. Dwellings for the Neil family dotted a part of the landscape.


