
• Using the Grades Setup Wizard

What is the Setup Wizard?

- The **Setup Wizard** prompts you to enter information that is critical when you begin setting up your Grades in Springboard!, mostly about how you want Springboard! to calculate your final grade and how you want to display grades to students.
- Most of the settings available in the Setup Wizard are also available under the *Grades Settings* link. The *Setup Wizard* does not include settings for your personal view of Grades, however; these are also available under *Grades Settings*.
- Alternatively, you can skip the Wizard altogether and enter the information by clicking Grades Settings. (Exception: You will need to enter the default grade scheme under Grades Schemes).



Using the Setup Wizard








Depending on how you want to structure your Grades, select the appropriate system:

- With the *Points System*, Springboard! calculates the total points of all items in all grade categories and converts as a fraction/total. The final grade is displayed in accordance with the applied grading scheme. You cannot weight grades using the Points System.
- With the Weighted System, individual grade items are weighted as a percentage of the grade category they are in (e.g., Quizzes), and the category is weighted as a percentage of the final grade. For example, Assignment 1 might count 10% toward the Assignments category, and the Assignments category might count 40% toward the final grade. Therefore, Assignment 1 would count 10% of 40%, or 4% toward the final grade.
- With the Formula System, Springboard! calculates the final grade based on a formula created by the instructor. This system offers additional flexibility. For example, using if/then statements, instructors could apply one calculation for graduate students and another for undergraduate students in the same course. Or, using the min function, instructors could require students to score at least 80% on all graded items to pass.

Step 2 of 7. You can opt to release the **Calculated Final Grade**, or the **Adjusted Final Grade**.

See notes below on the difference between the two final grade types.

Click Next.



The *Calculated Final Grade* is the grade Springboard! arrives at when it tallies *all* the grade items and applies your instructions about including non-graded items, dropping highest or lowest grades in a category (if applicable), and weighting grades (if applicable).

The **Adjusted Final Grade** is the calculated final grade *after* you have removed unwanted items (like a quiz everyone did poorly on) or made adjustments to individual student grades.



Step 3 of 7. Select to **Drop ungraded items** or **treat Ungraded Items as 0 (zero)** from the current grade calculation.


For example:

If it is week 3 of 15, a student grade would display as 30/30, with the denominator of 30 showing the possible number of points available to date.

If the ungraded items are treated as a 0 (zero), the student grade would be displayed as 30/150, with the denominator of 150 being the total points available for the entire semester.

You can also set the system to automatically keep the final grade updated by clicking the select box.

Once you have made your selections, click **Next**.



You decide whether or not Springboard! will include non-graded items in the final grade calculation. If you do include them, you may wish to refrain from displaying grade items to students until the grades have been entered.

Springboard! can automatically update the final grade each time you enter or modify a grade, although this can slow performance if you have a large class. If you do choose this option, you may wish to exclude non-graded items from the calculation rather than treat them as zero's.



Step 4 of 7. Select the **Default Grading Scheme** to be used for your course then
The system default is **Percentage**.


The College of Nursing. UA Grade Scheme is a scale (use with Points). Percentage is Points or Weights.

Once your selection has been made, click **Next**.

Step 5 of 7. Enter the **number of decimal places** to display. The system defaults to two (2) decimal places.

Once your selection has been made, click **Next**.




Step 6 of 7. Select the **Submission View Display Options** for what you would like the students to see.

- *Points Grade* is the point value (94.42)
- Grade Scheme Symbol is a letter grade (A-) or the percentage grade (94.42%)
- Grade Scheme Colors are set in the grade schemes. For example, red might indicate grades below 60 while blue might indicate scores above 90.

Check **Display Final Grade** to display the Final Grade Calculation to students.

Once your selection has been made, click **Next**.





Step 7 of 7. Review the selections you have made and then click **Finish** to complete the Grade Setup Wizard.

NOTE: These seven (7) steps can be revisited at any time and you can make changes as you deem necessary.
