Marilyn R. Crabtree, 93, of Medina, passed away peacefully surrounded by her family at the Medina Hospital on Friday, January 7, 2022. She finally succumbed to a condition affecting her breathing that she had been battling courageously for many years.

She was a force of nature and an inspiration to all she met. She was intelligent, athletic, determined, artistic and talented at everything she turned her hand to: painting, tennis, gardening, home remodeling, and more. She loved books, art, square dancing, bridge, hiking, and her many friends.

She graduated from Washington University in St. Louis with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree at a time when fewer than 10 percent of women attended university. After college, she worked as an illustrator before marrying and becoming a homemaker, but she continued to paint for most of her life. After being diagnosed with bullous emphysema at 75, she doggedly continued to square dance and play tennis several times a week with a portable tank of oxygen strapped to her waist until she was 85. She was vivacious and warm, and people loved to be around her. Friends said: 'From the minute I met her, I felt like I'd known her forever.'



Marilyn loved to play Bridge, but even more she enjoyed the lively conversations we'd have when we met each month for lunch and Bridge at Rockynol or evening Bridge at member's homes. Even with all her breathing problems Marilyn was 'young at heart', always eager to hear all the news and just was such a people person. Her last days were blessed: Her husband told her how much he loved her; she was 'my beautiful, talented wife, my life, my heart, my soul, my everything.' She told him how much she loved him. Her children and grandchildren each told her how much they loved her and she told them the same. She said, 'I feel so warm, so loved; I could just burst.'



Book Review

Sixteen UAWC members met to discuss Isabel Allende's Soul of a Woman via Zoom January 19, 2022. Ginny Ballinger led the review using questions based on themes that she selected from book (feminism, careers, beauty, passion, mentorship, sensuality, aging, and retirement). She reminded us that Isabel Allende, who grew up in Chile but is now a U.S. citizen, writes in Spanish although she is perfectly fluent in English and books (all 21 of them) are then translated into English. The Spanish title is *The Soul of a Woman: On Impatient Love, Long Life and Good Witches.* A lively discussion ensued. Several members remarked that although women have achieved a great deal in terms of rights and freedom since the 1960's and 1970's when many of us entered adulthood, there is evidence that progress is reversing itself in this country. Our discussion was not limited to issues within the U.S. border as women's issues are global ones.

We were disappointed not to have an in-person gathering but managed to engage members through technology thanks to Hillary Sullivan. 
Diane Vukovich

Diane and her husband, Tom, have lived in the Goodyear Heights area of Akron (in a house built in 1919) since they both joined The University of Akron in 1972. Diane has been a member of the UAWC (then named Faculty Women's Club) shortly after arriving at the University. Carolyn Cox had an office right next to Diane, and it was Carolyn that motivated Diane to join and stay active!

Diane and Tom both worked at the University. He started as an academic advisor and held several other positions, including interim dean of University College, before becoming Associate Provost for Student and Enrollment Services. Diane earned her Ph.D. in Education at the University in 1975 and started teaching Basic Mathematics and Developmental Chemistry in the Department of Developmental Programs. She was active in her professional associations and served as president of both the Ohio and the National Association of Developmental Education. Diane remained with Developmental Programs throughout her career at the University and became Assistant Director and then Director of the Department. She also worked for many years with a partner in the Mathematics Department to write grants to support teacher training workshops for middle and high school math teachers. Both Diane and Tom retired via the last of the University's 'buy-out' programs in 2000.

Diane has held various positions through the UAWC serving as President and member of the Scholarship Committee in which she will chair for the 2022-23 fiscal year. She enjoys seeing everyone at the General meetings and wishes she had time to participate in other activities offered. However, she is also very active with the Akron Woman's City Club. Her and Tom also serve as program co-chairs for the Association of The University of Akron Retirees, and they both volunteer at the Akron Zoo.



Tom has one brother, Joe who is a lawyer and an Ohio state representative and senator. Later he became a

judge for the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals.
