USG FINANCIAL REVIEW

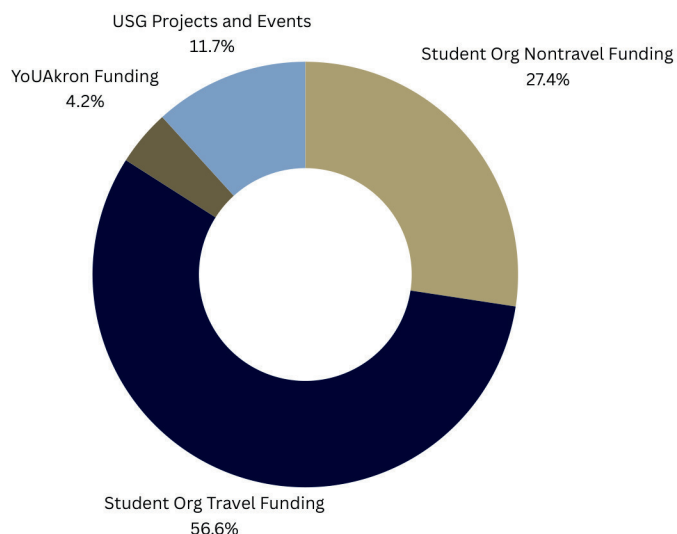
Undergraduate Student Government has the privilege of managing funds that sponsor travel and projects for the more than 300 student organizations on the University of Akron's Campus. We have been able to provide support to over 120 student organizations through the course of the 2023-2024 academic year and have pledged our support to various programs that will benefit the Zips community for years to come.

Student Org Allocations

Through the Undergraduate Activities Fund, USG has provided \$147,555 to student organization. They have provided funding for...

- 55 student organizations to travel to conferences or professional development opportunities,
- 68 students organizations' projects and events

Additionally, the YouAkron platform fund has provided \$6,927 to student organizations and co-sponsored initiatives and functions that fall under the platform pillars of Elevating Campus Experiences, Encouraging Student Excellence, and Developing a Lasting Community.



Allocations at Work

The Exercise Science Club attended the National ACSM Conference in Denver, Colorado where they had the opportunity to attend lectures, learn from research posters, and participate in testing a new E-stim workout equipment through the help of UAF Travel Funding.

UA Ambassadors hosted a banquet as a part of their annual "5 Under 35" Alumni Awards Event, fostering further connections and networking between attendees using UAF Nontravel Funding.



EXECUTIVE BRANCH

The Executive branch consists of appointed members, as well as the President and Vice-President that are elected by the undergraduate student body. Members of the Executive Branch work to carry out the USG Platform. Appointed members of USG include a variety of roles that focus on areas such as:

- Project and Event Facilitation
- Finance and Budget Review
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- Community and Campus Engagement
- Membership Development
- Image and Marketing

All Executive Branch members play a vital role in USG's mission and activities throughout the academic year! Additionally, the Executive Branch facilitates three committees: Campus Dining Experience Committee, Mental Health Task Force, and Diversity Committee. These committees, whose membership includes both USG and non-USG members, facilitate projects and events that align with their mission.

JUDICIAL BRANCH

The Judicial Branch consists of an appointed panel of Justices including the Executive Justice and the Chief Justice.

Justices interpret and revise governing documents, review student organizational grievances, run both fall and spring USG elections and election events, maintain USG record-keeping, and work towards general advocacy to benefit the student body at the University of Akron.



Advocacy Week

This year, the Judicial Branch underwent many changes in regard to their responsibilities to meet the needs of campus. They organized a week of advocacy aimed at connecting students to various resources on campus, with a focus on mental, physical, financial, and academic health. This initiative involved collaboration from across campus, including The Office of Accessibility, The Student Rec Center, The H. K. Barker Center for Financial Education, The Campus Cupboard, the Counseling and Testing Center, Career Services, Office of Financial Aid, Bierce Library, and Tutoring Services.

Elections Board

During elections season, the Judicial Branch transforms into the Elections Board, the governing body that oversees the USG elections process, election materials, and voting verification. The Elections Board ensures a fair and friendly competition that aims to provide the best representative for the study body.

Spring 2024 Voting Turnout

The 2024 Spring Election cycle witnessed an approximately 3% rise in voter turnout compared to previous uncontested Spring Election Cycles.

Through the elections board's continuous efforts to engage the student body through candidate meet and greets, candidate debates, and social media, they aim to increase these numbers year-to-year to best serve the undergraduate study body.





LEGISLATIVE BRANCH



The Legislative branch consists of numerous elected members, including:

Mental Health Resources: Mental Health Taskforce organized several events throughout the semester to support students and bring awareness to the importance of mental health. From a hot chocolate bar to a stress ball workshop, they worked to advocate for students' wellbeing!



Sustainability Efforts: Throughout various committees and personal projects, USG sought out ways to increase the sustainability efforts on our campus. This included bottle cap recycling projects, the implementation of additional recycling signs, and the installment of a Campus Pollinator Certification!

Advocating for Academics: USG Senate passed Senate Resolution 23-24-01, legislation urging University Administration to adopt the First Day Complete Program, a textbook program that would provide more affordable options for students. Members of USG also made efforts to research the First Day Complete program education on other campuses to ensure smooth transition for students.



Connecting Students: USG held its second annual Student Leader Summit, and event focused on bringing together students organization leaders to promote collaboration, share campus resources, and discuss common issues. Additionally, USG implemented a sister-event, the Student Leader Showcase, aimed to celebrate student organization accomplishments and achievements throughout the year!

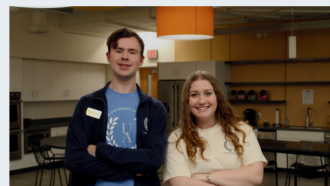
Sixty-six representatives from 11 institutions across Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Indiana joined together to exchange ideas, build connections, and foster development within student governments.
