• Legislative Branch Report

And then once we get that, we'll find out those committee assignments and hopefully get those finalized if not by the end of the week then by the end of today. And then onboarding is in discussion after this meeting; we have a nice presentation for you all to get you acclimated to your roles.

• Judicial Branch Report

Chief Justice Stillion: The application for the fall election cycle closes tonight at 11:59 pm. If you know any freshmen that may be interested, please let them know. Next week, we will have our candidate meeting for everyone who has applied through that application, that is Wednesday, 9/18. The elections board will be there so that will be a pretty interesting time. Then the week after that, we will be having 2 meet and greets where the candidates will have the opportunity to campaign directly to the student body. For things happening this week and the past weeks in USG specifically, the bylaw review and bylaw amendments have passed in the judicial branch this Monday. They have passed in the Judicial Branch and they have passed in the Senate so they're now active. We have assigned our records keeping roles as well. For those that are branch coordinators, they will be reaching our already to their branch heads to just let you know who you are and what your position is, and these are the positions that all the branch heads will be sending their documents to, so that will be put into the teams. People who have chosen to be committee heads should also receive an email from our Legislative

Branch Representative Leader. That will be the person you are sending your minutes to, your agendas to, and all of the important documentation that you want to put into the teams regarding those committee meetings.

For the other things that we have been working on in the judicial branch, we've been working pretty heavily with the department of student conduct, we presented at a number of the Akron student seminars this past week, which are the classes that most freshmen have to take, where we went over the code of student conduct and advertised the first year election cycle. We also work with Uakron Park pretty heavily. If you haven't, it is week three, so make sure to get your parking pass as so as you can. They asked us to advertise a collaboration with "A Band called Applesauce," which is a punk-rock band that Uakron Park is helping to put on before the football game this Saturday, 9/14. There's a flyer in the teams, there's some in the USG office. There's going to be a Dunkin Donuts truck parked nearby I believe giving out free goodies. The Trunk or Treat is tentative for October 26<sup>th</sup>, but we're probably going to move it back to the Trunk or Treat that usually happens with University of Akron at Leggett Elementary and we're also going to be working with them in creating a parking town hall in the coming weeks and sending a parking survey to the undergraduate student body trying to gauge their opinions on what maybe parking can do better and specific issues they may have.

• Executive Branch Report

If you're interested in joining, you can either reach out to me or the chairs. They should be on the membership list that our Director of Membership Development is sending out. And those are just biweekly commitments, so super low commitment.

And then events, USG had a presence at 10 events for welcome back activities. We also had Hooked on Healing event with ZAB on Tuesday from 12-2 in the Student Union.
