• Legislative Branch Report

#### • Judicial Branch Report

Chief Justice Stillion: The big thing to cover is that voting did close for the first-year senator election on Wednesday. We have one candidate that is being sworn in today and two candidates that tied so we will be moving into a roll-off election, so voting will open on Monday at 8 am and close on Tuesday at 5 pm, so that's October 7<sup>th</sup> to October 8<sup>th</sup>. We haven't had a tie happen in a long time so that's very exciting. I still want to thank these three people for all their help in the election. Social Media Strategist Nathan Flint was incredibly flexible and is still working with us for the roll-off election. Event Coordinator AJ Stewart was instrumental in helping us get locations locked down for the candidate meet-and-greets, and I believe he even called one of the offices after hours and left a voicemail to get updates for us. Director of Event Coordination Maggie Mahaney was also incredibly influential and necessary for this election. Moving on from that, we are into the beginning of our election review. After each election, we send out a feedback form to see what went well and what can be fixed for the future as well as internal review on our own end, which will be happening next week and the week after. After that, we will be shifting our focus to working on an internal newsletter. Lining up with our records keeping roles, we're trying to bring transparency to our organization. Sometimes you don't know what's going on in other branches, so we have an idea to highlight personal projects without you having to dig through minutes to find out what happened in a

meeting you missed. The judicial branch is working with the Department of Student Conduct and Community Standards to staff some of those alcohol awareness events, specifically the event on October 17<sup>th</sup>, the rootbeer kegger. This will count as an oncampus event for your membership requirements. And then hearing board training, that is still open, and the application closes next week so if you're interested, please take a look at the application on our Instagram.

#### • Executive Branch Report

• D.E.I. Report

Deputy Director Cosgrave: Rethinking Race week is coming up. The theme is Rethinking Race and health equity, promoting health and care for all. In case you don't know, it's a weeklong event that happens in the fall to elevate our knowledge on race and how it impacts our students and communities. We choose a different theme for each year and USG has a pretty integral part on how this functions. The DEI actually got our proposal for our event approved.
