VIII. Branch Reports

• Finance Report

Director Howell

Director Howell: This was the most chill week of all time. Nothing was really approved except for the national convention for Tau Beta Pi. That was something we had to work through for a while because of the new funding limits. The people that wanted to go can go. For USG expenses, we have the all-USG retreat, so that should be good. I met with a source today and we talked about the new allocation limits. Handling emails was also a lot easier than I thought. Advisor Alexander: Do you want to talk about the resource we talked about today for ways to get funding.

Director Howell: In the emails, we will start to go over a bunch of different ways for student orgs to get funding and that will be very clear.

Vice President Kozma: Did you want to tell everyone about the business travel fee?

Director Howell: In past years, we used to partner with Christopherson Business Travel,

but the university isn't partnered with them anymore. Student organizations are largely on their own now for travel expenses, but they can use the conferences or Expedia to plan now. We're talking about officially striking that language from a few forms but if anyone asks about that, we are no longer using them.

Senate Chair Feezel: Does that also include rental cars?

Director Howell: They're still working on that. I'm not sure how that works out and they don't have that pieced together either. If I hear anything, we'll get that out to student organizations as soon as possible.

• Executive Branch Report

President DeWitt

President DeWitt: Lots of crazy things happening in EB this week and next week. The USG Retreat is happening this Friday in the Honors Common Room from 3:00-6:00pm. You're getting free Chipotle and it is self-serve. That is required and it will be a lot of fun. For past meetings that happened this week, we had the mental health task force positivity painting, and we ran out of pumpkins. Bridging Campus and Community with Mayor Malik also happened; we had a big turnout, and they were very thankful.
