In terms of parking passes, there have been some difficulties with the parking passes for this semester. Student employees were mislabeled and were offered regular staff passes but it is pretty easy to fix if you email or call them. I had that issue but within the hour, I got the correct parking pass. Let anyone you may know having that issue about this. We have an open associate justice position so if you know anyone interested in that, point them toward that direction.

#### • Legislative Branch Report

Senate Chair Feezel: We are planning our spring senate meeting guest speaker schedules. We're reaching out to a few facilities based on the projects that your committees are working on right now. We are reaching out to the physical facilities department, the office of accessibility, ZipAssist, and the provost's office. The university library is on the docket for next week as well so we will have a focus group with them about a new library system. We have three vacancies right now: the College of Engineering and Polymer Science senator, Senator at Large, and the Senator for the College of Health and Human Sciences. For ongoing tasks, make sure

you update your outlook calendar and recurring meetings are in there so it's easier to schedule things with you. Fill out your project trackers and fill those out if you didn't last semester. We haven't' really detailed that in a senate yet so you aren't really expected to know how to do it already. Make sure you schedule your office hours because that's due by the end of this week.

President DeWitt: University Council met this past week. The president had a report and said that there are about 500 or so graduates. He referenced a lot of things in his welcome back email. He talked about the Browns partnership and the internships that they are providing. They're looking for a dean of athletics soon but there's an interim person at the moment. The provost touched a little bit on retrenchment. They're working with the union for faculty to find alternatives for them. Lastly, the business dean search did not find the right fit so there's going to be more of a search for that this year. The deadline for retrenchment is being decided by committee. Proposals are due March 3<sup>rd</sup> with a final request by President Nemer and that will be decided at the April board meeting when it is presented to the board. We also had a speaker talking about the UA admin process transformation to increase efficieny for finance, HR, and IT. There's minutes if you'd like to see exactly what they said and you can always attend the next one in February if you'd like to see that.

Senate Chair Feezel: Retrenchment means budget cuts if you did not know.
