USG FINANCIAL REVIEW

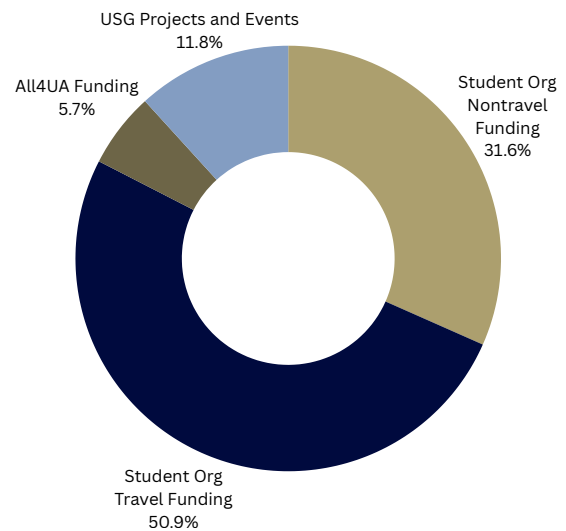
Undergraduate Student Government has the privilege of managing funds that sponsor travel and projects for the more than 300 student organizations on the University of Akron's Campus. We have been able to provide support to over 90 student organizations through the course of the 2025-2026 academic year and have pledged our support to various programs that will benefit the Zips community for years to come.

Student Org Allocations

Through the Undergraduate Activities Fund, USG has provided \$58,784.78 to student organization. They have provided funding for...

- 42 student organizations to travel to conferences or professional development opportunities,
- 52 students organizations' projects and events

Additionally, the All4UA platform fund has provided \$4,043.40 to student organizations and co-sponsored initiatives and functions that fall under the platform pillars of Amplifying Academic Opportunities, Enhancing the Community, Expanding Personal Growth, and Empowering Students Perspectives.



Longterm Initiative Funding

USG's Longterm Initiatives fund was used to purchase and install a Pride Flag in the Student Union Piano Lounge to finalize a legislative branch project from the previous year.

USG provided funding to ZipAssist from their Longterm Initiatives fund for assistance funding the Aunt Flow products provided to students across campus.



EXECUTIVE BRANCH

The Executive branch consists of appointed members, as well as the President and Vice-President that are elected by the undergraduate student body. Members of the Executive Branch work to carry out the USG Platform. Appointed members of USG include a variety of roles that focus on areas such as:

PROJECT COORDINATION TEAM



The Project coordination team is tasked with plan and run events centered around the pillars of the All4UA platform. This team planned and executed 34 events this year, with a majority of the events focusing on the enhancing the community pillar of the All4UA platform



CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH TEAM

The purpose of the Campus and Community Outreach Team is to serve as a bridge between the student body and the Akron community. The team works to actively listen to student feedback on areas that need improvement and uses that input to develop initiatives that enhance the overall student experience. They collaborate with campus and community organizations to provide valuable resources that support students both now and in the future. Additionally, they engage with Greek life to strengthen involvement and maintain a strong connection with USG. They also prioritize building relationships with Athletics to ensure a solid partnership and demonstrate that USG is available to support their needs whenever possible.





MENTAL HEALTH TASK FORCE

Their purpose is to promote mental health and well-being to students within the UA Community through programs and general outreach.

Due to a lack of on-campus involvement and interest in the committee, the Mental Health Task Force was suspended on February 12th, 2026, by an Executive Order, which was then approved by Senate.



CAMPUS DINING EXPERIENCE COMMITTEE

Their purpose is to enhance student experience with UA Dining Service.

Projects: *Addressing concerns of cross contamination at food stations both at Rob's and at the Union, helping Senator Pence with their project of donating left-over meal swipe, trying to increase meal swipe options for students during Ramadan*

Due to a lack of on-campus involvement and interest in the committee, the Campus Dining Experience Committee was suspended on February 12th, 2026, by an Executive Order, which was then approved by Senate vote.

DIVERSITY COMMITTEE



Their purpose is to bring together student voices to identify concerns and promote inclusive initiatives. They serve as a platform for discussing diversity, equity, and inclusion across campus.



JUDICIAL BRANCH

The Judicial Branch consists of an appointed panel of five Associate Justices, as well as the Executive Justice and the Chief Justice.

Justices interpret and revise governing documents, review student organizational grievances, run both fall and spring USG elections and election events, maintain USG record-keeping, and work towards general advocacy to benefit the student body at the University of Akron.

Advocacy

The Judicial Branch works alongside the Department of Student Conduct and Community Standards and UAkronPark in order to provide a student perspective and on campus and parking issues. This year, the branch tabled for Student Conduct's annual Rootbeer Kegger, tabled at the Sexual Assault Awareness event, went over the Code of Conduct in first year seminar courses, tabled for feedback for UAkronPark, and assisted in the interview process of Student Conduct's new Assistant Director.

SOuRCe Initiative

This year, the Judicial Branch took on a new responsibility and began collaborating with the SOuRCe Office to help with their new student organization approval process. The branch has approved 3 student organizations since the initiative began and reached out to 16, and was honored with an Initiative of the Year Award at the USG End-of-Year Awards Ceremony.

Elections

The Judicial Branch works as the Elections Board during the Fall and Spring election cycles and is responsible for running the the USG elections process. This year, the branch ran the Fall election for two First-Year senators, the Spring election for 16 senator positions, and a special election to elect out President and Vice President.

Fall Election Cycle: 82 votes were cast out of 3,092 potential voters

- 2.65% of potential voters

Spring Election Cycle: 257 votes were cast out of 8,986 potential voters

- 2.86% of potential voters

Special Election Cycle: 241 votes were cast out of 8,986 potential voters

- 2.68% of potential voters





LEGISLATIVE BRANCH



The Legislative Branch is made up of elected senators who represent the student body. Senators write legislation and pursue projects and initiatives to better the student experience on campus. We advocate on behalf of students to ensure that their concerns are heard and addressed.

The Legislative branch consists of 16 elected members, including:

- Residence Life Senator
- Off-Campus Living Senator
- First-Year Senators (2)

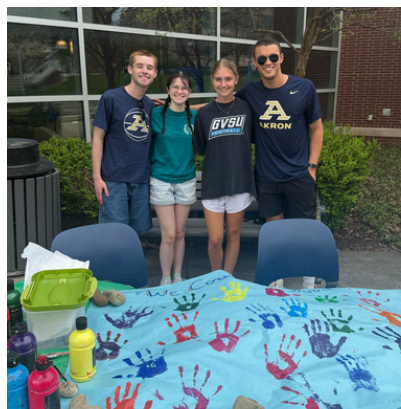

SR-07-25-26

This Senate Resolution requests that The University of Akron provide sexual assault information (Including Title IX) inside bathroom stalls. This also urges respective personnel to provide trauma response information to new students during check-in. It was sponsored by Senator Kleinschmidt, Senator Swaminathan, Senator Blankenship, and Senator Moore



SR-05-25-26

This Senate Resolution encouraged The University of Akron and the City of Akron to work on the maintenance of the University Bridge which serves as a connection point between campus and Downtown Akron. The bridge was in a condition which raised concerns of accessibility and safety. This Resolution was sponsored by Senator Shelton, Senator McCracken, and Senator Prough.

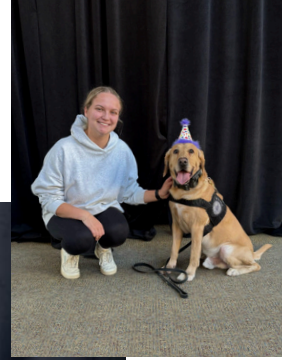


EVENT SPOTLIGHTS

SAFETY GRANT

USG hosted our first of three Safety First for Zips workshops on Wednesday, September 3rd. We invited UAPD, the Department of Student Life, and our local PNC bank representatives to host a table with informative information on how to stay safe on campus, at events, and with your finances. At the event, students were able to enter to win a free Ring doorbell for their off-campus apartments, get free giveaways, like our seat belts cutters, Birdie alarms, RFID anti-scan wallets, bike/scooter locks, and potable keychain lights. Each station had a different UAPD officer working it, allowing them all to introduce and get to know each student. At the end of the event, students got a chance to meet Duncan, our UAPD K9, snap a photo with him, and get a free t-shirt with his face and information on it!

This entire event served as a safe space for students to ask questions about safety on campus, feel open to talking with and getting to know our UAPD officers, and feel prepared for next time they are walking on campus alone with their new safety giveaways. The event attendance was officially 330 people.



WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT SUMMIT

On March 16, USG hosted its annual Women's Empowerment Summit. Attendees had the pleasure of hearing from a panel of female student leaders about their experiences on campus and in their positions. There was also a panel of women in the professional field from around the area, each chosen by the attending student organizations. Students were able to ask them questions about their experiences in their careers, especially in relation to their status as women. Following this, a student presented on strategies to deal with sexist comments in a professional way, leaving off with an activity to practice these skills. Overall, the Women's Empowerment Summit was a great way to celebrate the women on our campus and in the area, as well as have important conversations about being a woman in the professional world.



STUDENT LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

The Executive Branch hosted USG's annual Student Leadership Summit on September 15. Presentations were given by President Shaw, Vice President Tsige and Director of Finance Damson to inform students about how we operate our finances, both internally and externally, and how organizations can obtain different forms of funding. The presentations were followed by roundtables where attendees discussed topics like prioritizing balance, innovation and growth, engagement and involvement, and building connections. A total of 41 students attended the event.





USG FALL AND SPRING RETREATS

Each semester, all our members meet for an evening of team bonding and fun. The USG retreats are intended to recenter our focus as an organization. This fall, we had Katherine Miracle come in to speak to us about teamwork. We also worked together to complete a scavenger hunt alongside members of different branches. This was a great opportunity to learn more about each other and improve our teamwork skills. In the spring semester, Dr. Anna Ball came to speak to us about what true advocacy looks like. These events allow our members to engage with community members and remember our values as an organization.
