Director Damson: So for this week, we've allocated for \$418.33 to the student organizations for non-travel and travel. Within USG, we spend \$388.28. And thanks to the executive order that passed here, we've allocated \$2500 for the Aunt Flow project. I mean, thank you, President Shop, for reminding me about those expenses. So, I'm gonna give a bit of a retraining and like breakdown of how expenses work in USG. So usually, you have an event that you need to do, and you need to buy something for it. So you generally talk about what your branch heads and everything or your director, or never mind, senators, and then, you know, then after you have that, after you do this and make sure that it's good, the event aligns with everything we want to do, you reach out to the project's team and then your marketing and everything. The event is done. Make sure that as soon as the event has been, send me the receipt or that same week, because then it's going to go into the next week, or at the latest, early next week, because I use those and then I submit it before Wednesday for the legislative branch. But yes, please, please,

please, please, always have those in check. And I'll probably harass you or chase you, if I don't have those. But yeah, any questions? Thank you.

DLT Report

President Shaw

President Shaw: So, we had a very productive deal too this week. Um, I know starting off, we had two guests. We had two guests. It was just so exciting. Oh, so shout out Senator Swaminathan and Senator Bass. Please, people come to DLT. We have such a good time. So, but anybody, unless we enter an executive session, which this week we didn't, so you guys were safe. Anyways, um, moving on, we immediately dove into some international student concerns.

Um, so we DLT decided that since we are a nonpartisan organization, we want to take some action through, um, either the legislative or the executive branch, um, to urge the university to act to provide as much information to students as they can regarding, um, I.C.E protocols. Um, and from there, um, we are hoping to partner with them and help them in any way that we can, but we decided that since, like I said, we are a non partisan organization. Um, We want the initial communication to come from the university and not from USG. But from there, USG wants to help, like I said, however we can. Um, we wanna share and spread that information to the general body, make sure that's accessible to everybody. Um, additionally, Chief of Staff Kelly went through and, um, provided, um, a very extensive list. She did a lot of research. You don't have to open it. Um, just of public Ohio University, ice protocols and suit responses.

Um, so I highly encourage you if you're interested in this topic to look through that. Um, again, thank you to Chief of Staff Kelly, we really appreciate that. Um, campus outreach initiative. So, from there, as of the DLT meeting, I know we've received more from them, but we have received 44 new responses. So, we discussed each individual submission, um, and we

assign members, teams, or committees, um, certain submissions to send responses to, um, specifically the ones that were chosen not to be anonymous. So, ones that we have names for and emails for, um, So if your team or your committee has been reached out to, excuse me, I have the hiccups. Um, we would kindly request that you respond to them as soon as you possibly can, just so we can get this rolling. Um, and if you have any questions about that, or, of course, have our, have your email approved, um, let your branch heads know, or let DLT as a whole know, we'll be happy to help. Additionally, we discussed, um, the new advisor search. So, we discussed our internal timeline as DLT and what that process will look like. Um, so if anybody has any potential recommendations, um, for another co advisor, please let DLT know, um, or if you have any questions about what that process may look like. Um, it is in the DLT meeting minutes, or you can ask any of us. We'll be happy to provide any information. Um, my thunder was also stolen by Advisor Ernst, but, um, we also discussed the, um, event safety materials and an event called, or an initiative called the United States of Kindness. Um, so the event safety kits, um, like advisor, just discussed, are available for student orgs to borrow from student life. including some of those materials. And then additionally, we talked briefly about the United States of Kindness event. So that's a state of Ohio initiative from the state house that we are looking into and potentially collaborating, not collaborating. Um, participating in. Um, so more to come on that, as we discuss, and decide what we're going to do with that. Um, additionally, we talked about life awards. So just an update, the DEI team voted last Friday on the individual and organization diversity award, and the F.A.S.T. Committee voted on the Sustainability Award. So, all 3 of those awards have been submitted. Those are solidified. Um, and just an update DLT will soon be voting on the A.K. Blue and A.K. Gold Awards, as well as the faculty award, um, next Thursday after 7pm. Um, So it'll be really fun at the end of your award ceremony. So, um, the

Chief of Staff team is looking into different attire, the RSVP form, catering, awards, invites, et cetera, getting that all figured out, so thank you, um, Chief of Staff Kelly and her team. Um, and like I said, any of your words are closed this Friday, so please submit, um, those as well. Um, and then, sort of the last thing is we discuss very briefly transition packets. So DLT's transition packets are due Friday before spring break, thank you. Um, to, of course, myself, membership of the coordinator Winters and Advisor Ferguson-Mike for review. Elections Chair Stillion: Everyone will be getting an email on Monday. with a link to the ballot.

It is an individualized link. You cannot send it to your friend if your friend can't find their email. Because then, if they use that link that you sent them, their goal will show up under your name. And then you can't vote. So, it's very important that you keep your link, if your friend needs to find a link show them the email. You go look in their email. Everybody gets one. Monday. 8 am until Thursday at 5pm. Right before this meeting starts. So next time I talk to you, I might have numbers. I can't promise I will. And is still continuing that A.P.S.S. social media initiative. Then Senator Sterns, finally got his legislation passed, so that was great. He also met up with UAPD and a chemical lab assistant or employee. We weren't sure what that official title was. XI. Judicial Branch Grievance Opinion

- EDD 02-25-26 Stillion v. Stalnaker Executive Justice Reimer

Executive Justice Reimer: Hi, hi, everyone. I'm back again. Can't get rid of me. Um, so today, I am presenting the grievance opinion to Senate, as we do for transparency reasons. I want to cover a couple things before I start, though. First of all, you may notice that we have a new notation for the way that we prefer to our grievances. So, EDD refers to election dispute decision. And then we also have constitutional agreements, so that would be CDD for constitutional dispute decision. So we're now numbering those just for a better organizational purposes and to be aware of kind of how many we deal with any calendar year or sorry, I kind of like year. And then 2nd of all, you may notice that I don't have the document here with me today. We had some discussions in our meeting on Tuesday. We've decided that moving forward, it would be best for us to simply post the opinion on the USG website. So if you go to the USG website, which I'm not telling you to do right now, please do not do it right now. After the meeting, you will be able to see all of the opinions that we've made in the last year, this past year and last year as well. So those will be uploaded onto there for now on. So that is where you will be able to view those rather than presenting them to the Senate. We just feel that this is the best way to be transparent with everyone, kind of the purpose of presenting it to you is that way you can disseminate that down to your constituents, but I don't necessarily think that that's the best way to go about that. have any of you done that? Right. So this is how we're going to be doing that from now on. If you have any questions about the grievance itself, after you read it, you can always email me. Do any of you have any questions right now, though? All right. Thank you guys.

Vice Senate Chair McCracken: Just before we adjourn. Thank you all for paying attention. The Akron Zips have made it onto the 2nd round.

President Shaw: One more thing. I forgot to mention. Um, the student trustee application, technically, closes tomorrow. Um, but I'm in communication with the committee to extend that deadline. Um, so I just kind of wanted to promote it again here, um, if you're in addition to being a, or applying to be a student trustee for the university, um, and do you have any questions you have? Like I said, the application, we believe, you're going to push at least through this weekend, maybe into next week. Um, But more information is online and we are hoping to get, um, more, I guess, quote unquote, testimonials in a way, from this current trustees. So again, if anybody has any questions about what that process is, what Christie does, what it looks like, um, let me know, and I will reach out.
