b. Judicial Branch Report

Associate Justice Adams

Associate Justice Adams: Hello. Um, so, for this week, you're gonna go to the election review, so, um, that's basically discussing and going over, um, the responses we got back from the regular election. And these responses help guide us to amending the fall election roles. So if you haven't yet filled that out, you should. And then we also started working on the newsletter for March. And yeah, that's all. And then I have a meme.

Chief Justice Stillion: Uh, just two things to add to that, the link to that election's feedback form was sent out in President Shaw's email. It will be set out in that email over the next couple of weeks as weeks as we finish up the next election cycle as well. So, yeah, as associate Justice Adams said, please fill that out. It really helps us continue to include the election process. And the other thing is all of you should have gotten 2 emails from the UAkron Park over the last couple of days. I've mentioned it before in Senate, but for everyone, spring parking permit sales are closing today until April 27th. So if you were someone you know doesn't have a spring permit, buy it after Senate. Or you will have no other option but get ticketed for that time as they're shifting over their permit purchasing software to a new system, so we will no longer be using I Park after April 27th, after tonight, and the new system will come up on April 27th. So you should have all got an email that outlines that from UAkron Park, but just a reminder, please, let anyone you know know that.

Senate Chair Kasik: Now we move on to the executive branch report given by President Shaw.

c. Executive Branch Report President Shaw
President Shaw: Okay, so, um, of course, all you used to email, found my hidden question.

There's a lot of information in there. regarding specifically events and things happening in USG.

Um, so please be sure to look over that and let me know of any questions that you may have.

Um, so they get EB positions. So we are, we've made the decision that we are no longer hiring for this academic year, and rather, we will be redirecting people to the new application for EB

positions once it opens. Um, so if anybody is interested in that, either, um, going into next year or whatnot, um, that will be available at the conclusion of the special election. Um, Marketing and project requests. So the last day to submit any project or marketing request is April 9th, which is next week. And please note at this point, some requests may be subject to disapproval and postpone to next year based on the influx of events that we have for the remainder of this month. It's been kind of hard to schedule some things, and we just want to make sure that there's no overlapping events and no competing for events. in that way. Additionally, receive clarification, please continue to make sure to send receipts to the finance team for proper documentation. Um, end of your award ceremony, so every member must RSVP for, um, both themselves and a guest if you are bringing ones for the, um, award ceremony. And that is due next Thursday, April 9th. That RSVP is due. We will be reaching out early next week or mid next week to those who have not submitted it, just to ensure that, hey, we don't have a recorded thing for you, so make sure you submit that. Um, additionally, with the end of words, end of year award ceremony, um, for senior speeches, if you are a graduating senior, um, please fill out the sheet indicating who will be giving your speech at the end of award ceremony. Um, no later than April 10th, so the end of next week as well. Um, So a couple additional important dates to remember. I am not going to go. I didn't put all of the events on here because I know that our teams are here to do that. But, some important days to remember. Of course, we have our kids fundraiser after this. So if anybody needs any rides or anything of that sort, I know, a good majority of DLT and some other members are going. So please stick around. We can work that out. I have plenty of space in my car if you want to come. Um, but that is until 9 tonight. if you don't want to go immediately after Senate. Um, presentation night is next Thursday, the ninth from 730 to 9. Um, in Student Union 323. So, um, please email all presentations to um,

Membership Development Coordinator Winters and VP Viator by 12 by noon on April 9th, so the day before. That presentation night is literally for anybody that doesn't know, could be a presentation on anything. So you can present on anything, it could be serious, it could be funny. Um, anything of the sort, it's just a good way to kind of do a USG bonding activity. We did it twice last year. It was a lot of fun, so I highly recommend. So, that is, um, kind of an end of year recap of here's what all the teams did. Um, some achievements that we had, um, where everybody reports, of course, it's sort of like a, it's a more formalized presentation, all USG meeting, um, and it's just like a year interview for each team. President Shaw: April 30th from 5 to 7. We're still trying to find a location. We're having a little bit of trouble with that, but as soon as that's finalized, we'll let everybody know. Um, so for those who have not attended an inauguration meeting before, that is split into two meetings. Um, so I said last email. I met last meeting. ignore that. Last is... serves as the last meeting of this academic year, and then it transitions. We have a brief recess and it transitions into the 1st official meeting of the 26-27 academic year. So this is required for both outgoing and incoming members. So if you are a current member, of course, that is still required. But any members who are planning on coming back or any members that are hired through the EB application that will be opening soon, that is required for them as well, as we will be swearing people in. Um, hitting people and all of that fun stuff. So, um, last thing I have is a really quick, um, faculty Senate update. It was a very quick meeting today, so there's not much to report on regarding faculty Senate. Um but... Let me see what we have on here. Um, we listen to reports from, er, remarks from the chair. The executive committee, and brief president remarks. Provst Price was not in attendance, so there were no promo remarks. Um, the Curriculum Review Committee, um, we voted for the border, the board of trustees to, oh my goodness, I'm so sorry. We voted to approve 51 course and 50 program evaluations, um, and reviews, um, as a recommendation to the board of trustees, since that process changed a little bit. So, we recommended those up to the board trustees. Um, We heard a reviewed, we reviewed accredited versus not accredited programs, appendix from the program's review committee. Um, had a brief AUP, um, update a GSG update, our update, and a quick university council report. So not a lot going on in faculty center this week. A very brief meeting. It was about 25, 30 minutes. It was very quick, but, um, that's all I have for my report. Sorry, he's a little bit lengthy, but questions, yes.

Chief Justice Stillion: Did GSG talk at all about their special election?

President Shaw: They did not. So they said that they... From what I have heard, they did not report on this, but from what I've heard, I believe they elected their executive board, and they are running a special election for a set of positions. Yes, yes.

Chief of Staff Kelley: Switching gears entirely. the attire for the end of your awards. End of your awards is formal?

It's just not up here because it was after some of this. And then for requests, since last all All-USG, we got the rosary cover post, 33 other videos, sprinkling up the Ven post, and a learning perspective, colors and post supplier, cane fundraiser, speak your Zip, meet your senators, and the voting is open for the USG as well as presidential election and meeting group. Thank you.
